### Natural Christmas Decoration

### Help Mandy Mole make a simple twig star to hang on your Christmas Tree

#### You will need:

- 5 Twigs
- String or rubber bands
- Scissors



- 1 Cut five thin and bendy twigs to all the same length.
- To attach the sticks together, you can use string or rubber bands. If using string, cut five lengths about three to four inches long.
- Begin with two twigs. Attach them so the right twig is on top of the left twig. Pull the twigs apart about thirty degrees to create a point.
- Add the next twig, ensuring that it's on top of the last one. Each new twig you attach should be placed on top of the last one.
- Weave the fourth twig through the twigs, forming the star's top point.

  Weave under and over and attach it with string

  afterward.
- 6 When adding the last twig, it's easier to do the weaving first and then tie it in at both ends.
- The star looks great on it's own but you could also paint it or decorate it with holly and small pinecones.

Once you've made your star, it could be used as an ornament, a table settings, or to string onto a garland.

# Magic Reindeer Food



Every Christmas Eve we leave a mince pie and a drink for Father Christmas, and a carrot for Rudolph. But what about the other reindeer? Well, you can sprinkle some magic reindeer food outside for them too using this easy recipe.

### You will need:

- A handful of wild bird seed (which may include sunflower hearts, naked rolled oats, dried mealworms, yellow millet, kibbled peanuts and black sunflower seeds) – this is what helps the reindeers fly!
- A few rolled oats
- Some dried fruit, like cranberries
   (if you have a dog, please don't use
   grapes, raisins, sultanas or currants
   as these can be poisonous for them)
- Some dried insects Rudolph and his bird friends love mealworms and waxworms
- Some grated cheese
- A hint of chilli powder it helps keep Rudolph's nose glowing red and will stop squirrels and rodents from stealing the food before Rudolph arrives!
- A mixing bowl and spoon

### Optional:

• Cellophane bags and red ribbon

Mix it all together, then sprinkle it on your lawn or leave it in a bowl by your front door just before you go to bed.


